

Limited English Proficient Population in Region 1-B

The Five-Year American Community Survey 2009-2014 indicates that 5.7% (23,251) of older adults aged 65+ in Region 1-B are Limited English Proficient (LEP). Limited English Proficiency is defined as speaking English less than very well, as reported by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Ninety percent of Limited English Proficient Older Adults in Region 1-B live in Macomb and Oakland Counties. Macomb County has the highest prevalence of Limited English Proficient older adults, with 8.5% of the older adult population speaking English less than very well, followed by Oakland County (5.9%). The three smallest counties in the region, St. Clair, Monroe, and Livingston have the lowest percentages of Limited English Proficient older adults.

Region 1-B has a larger Limited English Proficient population than other areas of the state. Statewide 3.2% (46,244) of Michigan older adults are Limited English Proficient; half of the state's entire LEP older adult population lives in Region 1-B. In Wayne County 4.8% (11,230) of older adults 65+ are Limited English Proficient.

Languages Spoken by Limited English Proficient Older Adults

The majority (51%) of Limited English Proficient Older Adults in Region 1-B speak an Indo-European* language, while 27% speak "other languages" such as Arabic or Amharic. In Michigan, the most common languages other than English spoken by people of all ages are Spanish, Arabic, German, Chinese and French. There is a significant difference in the percentage of LEP Spanish speaking older adults in Wayne County, where 16% of LEP older adults speak Spanish, and Region 1-B, where 5% of LEP older adults speak Spanish.




Figure 1: Limited English Proficient Older Adults by Language Spoken in Region 1-B
