


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## Help and Support for Older Adults

Our Community Living Support Services are an umbrella of services that give older adults the extra support they need to stay living at home or in the community. These services are funded by state and federal dollars, and available to people 60 or older who live in our six-county region, which includes Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, and Washtenaw counties.

*There is no cost. We may ask for a contribution to help offset the costs for the care provided. Contributions are voluntary and do not impact services provided. This means you will still receive services if you do not provide a contribution.*

### Some Services May Have a Wait

We prioritize serving those who need support the most. This means there may be a wait for services even if you meet all of the qualifications.



## Community Living Support Services



### In-home Support

These are services in your home to help with everyday activities you may no longer be able to do for yourself. This can include keeping your home tidy, preparing meals, running errands, medication management, and transportation.

The types and level of in-home support you receive will depend on your situation and care needs.

- ✓ You must be 60 or older and in need of support to stay living in the community.



### Emergency Response Systems

This wearable pendant has a button you can push in case of an emergency to connect to a call center that can send help. It can help you stay safe at home, even if you live alone.

- ✓ You must be 60 or older and at risk for falls.



### Family Respite Program

This program can help family caregivers, caring for an older loved one who would benefit from a few hours off each week. The older adult can receive care at home or at an adult day center to give the family caregiver a break.

- ✓ The person receiving care must be 60 or older, need help caring for themselves, and have a loved one who provides unpaid care.
